Module 1 – ICD-10 Coding Basics (2 hours)

Knowing and understanding the basic coding conventions and rules is vital to accurate coding and payment. In this basics coding course, you will learn the coding conventions, coding guidelines, chapter specific guidelines, and apply it to the MDS and billing process.

ICD-10 accuracy is one key for success under PDPM. Your Medicare Team must learn to select the primary reason for admission and use correct and accurate codes on the MDS in Section I0020B to ensure optimal Clinical Category for PT, OT, and SLP components of the rate. Accurate coding of Section I also includes comorbidity diagnoses for Non-Therapy Ancillary (NTA) and SLP components.

- Review of PDPM ICD-10 qualifiers for PT/OT
- Review of PDPM ICD-10 qualifiers/comorbidities for SLP and NTA
- Potential Hospital Procedure coding implications on MDS
- Section I diagnosis coding and claim implications
- How to identify and ensure accurate coding of diagnosis to support optimal Case Mix Group
- Coding for COVID-19 and Vaping Related Disorders and impact on PDPM
